GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY CHAIR OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL

Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the September 3, 2019 Order ("Order") of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California, issued in response to the September 3, 2019 request for an emergency order made by the Superior Court of San Joaquin County ("Court"), this Court HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. For purposes of computing time for filing papers with the Court under Code of Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a, September 3, 2019, to September 4, 2019, inclusive, are deemed holidays (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(4));
- 2. For purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825, and Welfare and Institutions Code sections 313, 315, 334, 631, 632, 637, and 657, September 3, 2019, to September 4, 2019, inclusive, are deemed holidays (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(5));
- 3. In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire on September 3, 2019, to September 4, 2019, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time periods provided in sections 583.310 and 583.320 of the Code of Civil Procedure to bring an action to trial by not more than two days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(6));

- 4. Any judge of the Court may extend by not more than two days the duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire on September 3, 2019, to September 4, 2019, inclusive, because the emergency condition described in the Order prevented the Court from conducting proceedings to determine whether a permanent order should be entered (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(7));
- 5. In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire on September 3, 2019, to September 4, 2019, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court days to not more than 12 court days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(9)); and,
- 6. In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire on September 3, 2019, to September 4, 2019, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than two days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(10)).

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.
